Call for Entries

Public Service: Recent Civic Architecture

To: Architects, Designers, Contractors

Architecture Center Houston is requesting submissions of work designed for cities, counties, or state or federal agencies in the Houston-Galveston-Brazoria Consolidated Metropolitan Statistical Area (CMSA), which includes the following counties: Chambers, Fort Bend, Harris, Liberty, Montgomery, Waller, Galveston and Brazoria.

Categories for Entry:

- Built work, completed since 2007
- Unbuilt work

Submission Requirements:

- Portable electronic media (CD, USB Drive, etc.) with 10 or fewer digital images (photos, drawings, renderings), as an Adobe PDF presentation. Each slide should be 7½" x 10". Entire file should not exceed 22MB. Save file as the project name indicated on the entry form. All electronic media must be clearly labeled with the entrant's name and project name.
- Completed entry form
- An entry fee of **\$50** for AIA Members and **\$100** for non-members made payable to the ArCH Foundation.

Submit entry form, electronic media, and fee to the Architecture Center Houston (ArCH), 315 Capitol, Suite 120, Houston, TX 77002 (713-520-0155). If selected, submitters must provide a board for each selected project.

Selection Process/Criteria:

Projects will be evaluated by a jury of architectural professionals, based on (a) contribution of the project to Houston's built environment, (b) success of the project in meeting the end user's goals, and (c) sustainability of the project for civic use.

Entrants agree to provide a high quality 30" x 40" board of selected projects for the exhibition. A template will be provided.

Jury: Friday, August 13, 2010

Notification: Monday, August 16, 2010 via email

Boards due at ArCH: Friday, October 8, 2010

Exhibition Opening: Thursday, October 28, 2010; 5:30–8:00 P.M.

Exhibition: October 28, 2010 through January 14, 2011
